

Unfortunately, we missed out on the grant to upgrade the Ladies facilities at the east end of the club, we are currently reviewing what the cost will be to start the work at our own expense with moving the games office down the bottom end and opening that area for high tables with television on the wall above the bar which will in turn make the dining area much bigger and brighter.

We have renovated the main cold room with a new reticulation system that will save us approximately \$3,000 per year in beer wastage, the Point of Sale (POS) system will be fully operational by the 1st of July we are currently trialling the POS with menu and liquor products being loaded in the system. As from the 1st of July prices for non-members will increase by ten percent on all goods sold by the club, members will need to produce their membership card when purchasing food or bar products to receive the discounted price.

Our club made a profit of \$11,550 for the month of May whilst I'm pleased catering is now making a slight profit we are still looking at implementing different ways to keep us going onward and upward.





On the bowls front we had life members day which was just brilliant 84 bowlers my thanks on behalf of our members to our great life members for putting on a special day especially to Frank & Rose Geritz the cake was magnificent and to our other volunteers thank you.


