Chairperson's Report

Recently we have been advised that we were successful in our grant application to get funds to install a new Solar Power system. This is wonderful news and the new solar system will produce more electricity which will allow us to reduce our electricity bills. Further, using less electricity from the grid is more environmentally friendly. This grant came from the Queensland Government.

Also, we were awarded a grant from the Sunshine Coast City Council that will be used to replace some of the aging shades around the perimeter of the greens.

The club would like to thank and acknowledge the support of both the Queensland Government and the Sunshine Coast City Council.

Progress towards our plan of replacing green 1 is proceeding on track and our goal is to be in a position by the end of the year to replace the green if need be. The longer we can wait however before replacing the green, the more savings we will accumulate which is better for future plans.

The performance of the club is tracking quite nicely. The number of bowling and social members are at encouraging levels. The numbers of bowlers on the green is healthy as are the finances of the club, with all main areas of the club showing profit. Despite this good news, numbers in the Bar & Bistro are lower than we would like and we will be investigating reasons for this and developing plans to try and get more numbers into the club. We believe that COVID is one driver to this, as we know that tourism levels are down on the coast.

Finally, we'd like to wish a fellow member and friend Jon Butler, a speedy recovery. Get well soon Jon. Good bowling everybody.

BOWLS IS NOT A GAME OF PERFECT *Submitted by a member*

- ◆ One of the things any successful bowler does best is to accept not so good deliveries, shrug them off, and concentrate completely on the next one. They have accepted the fact that *"Bowls is not a game of perfect"*
- ◆ No matter what happens with any bowl you deliver, accept it. Acceptance is the last step in a sound routine.
- ◆ Good bowlers have to get over the notion that they only want to win by playing the perfect game. They have to learn to enjoy winning ugly. And that entails acceptance of all the bowls they deliver, not just the good ones.
- ◆ You could train yourself to accept the fact that as a human being, you are prone to mistakes. Bowls is a game played by human beings.
- ◆ The best bowlers strive to minimize bad deliveries, but they don't expect to eliminate them all. And they understand that it's most important to respond well to the mistakes they inevitably make. Bowls is indeed all about recovering from a not so good delivery.
- ◆ When a bowl is delivered, it is delivered. The only constructive thing you can do is to deliver the next bowl as well as you can. That requires that you stay optimistic and enthusiastic.
- ◆ Remember bowls is not always a game of justice. A bowler can practice properly, and still deliver a bad bowl. A bowler can't always force results to happen.
- ◆ A successful bowler has to develop the ability to evaluate themselves objectively, to work harder when they need more practice, but to ease up when they are tempted to push too hard.
- ◆ You have to remember to throw away expectations, to just have fun and see what's the best game you can play. You have to attend to the process (delivery and game plan), not concern yourself with the results. The results will look after itself.
- ◆ "Son everything that happens to you happens for the best. Don't ever forget that. You can't win all the time, son"

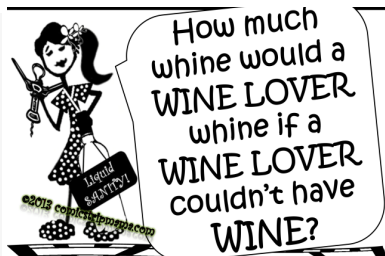

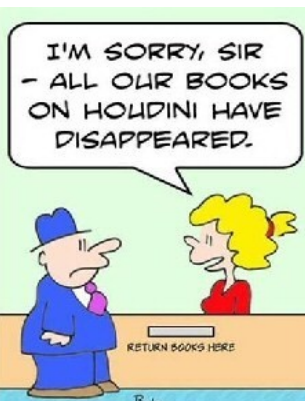
TRIVIA NIGHT

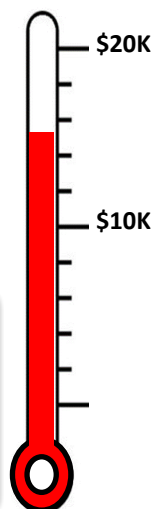
Coming Up we have our Birthday Bash, Snobs Memorial Seafood Challenge against Bramble Bay and of course our State of Origin Day.
