Finally, the COVID situation in NSW and other States reminds us COVID is definitely not behind us and lockdowns and closures remain an ever present threat. The strategy of the club remains a conservative one so that we can ensure that any lockdowns, while definitely creating a financial impact, will affect us to the most minimal level possible.

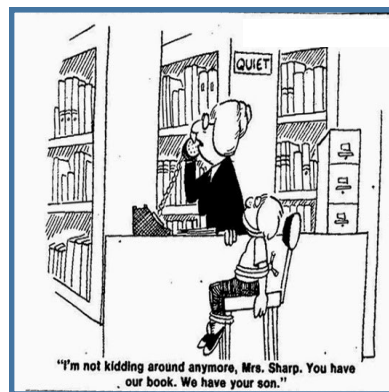

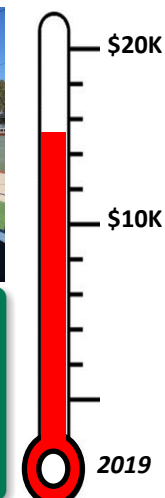
