The Laws and You

"Law" Questions

- Q 1. A lead has delivered the jack and played their first bowl. The opposing lead then queries the length of the jack. What must happen?
- Q 2. In a fours game, team A's second is about to play when they notice the mat and the jack have not been placed on the correct centre line. What must happen?
- Q 3. A player mistakenly delivers another player's bowl which touches the jack. What must happen?
- Q 4. Skip A in a team game is about to deliver their first bowl. At the head end, the jack is positioned about 6 metres from the front ditch and the nearest bowl to the front ditch, is 4 metres from that ditch. Skip A states that team B players at the head must be standing up on the surrounds of the rink. Is he correct?
- Q 5. In a triples game, team A played first. When the skips changed ends, the bowl of skip B had been placed on the mat and skip B bowled it, disturbing the head before the mistake was noticed. What must happen?

"You" Answers

NOTE: one of the answers below is incorrect. Which one? - see November's Pelican Brief.

- A 1. Play continues. The opposing lead must deliver their first bowl as once the first bowl in an end has been delivered, no one can challenge the distance of the jack. (Law Book page 22).
- A 2. The mat and the jack must be moved to the centre line before Team A's second delivers their bowl. (Law Book page 23 and 25).
- A 3. The other player's bowl must be replaced with the player's own bowl which must be marked or nominated as a toucher. It doesn't matter what teams the players were in. (Law Book page 41).
- A 4. In this situation, No. Players (team B) who are not in possession of the rink at the head end must stand behind the jack and away from the head. There is sufficient space behind and away from the head for team B players to stand. Only when the jack is in the ditch, must players stand up on the rink surrounds. (Law Book page 28).
- A 5. Team A skip must choose whether to: leave the disturbed head as it is and team A skip to play their two bowls one after the other to get back to the proper order; OR replace the head in its former position, return skip B's bowl and go back to the proper order play; OR declare the end dead. (Law Book page 41
