Hi Everyone and Welcome to another Pelican Brief.

The big news as I type this report is that the new surface for Green #1 is in the process of being laid. It will probably be finished and in play by the time you are reading this Pelican Brief.

Our attention now turns towards what do we do with Green #2? Originally we had in the Strategic Plan to replace Green #2 in 2024, but that is simply not going to be feasible. Green #2 is now beginning to play quite poorly on some of the rinks. After looking at options, including renovating just the ditches or lifting the carpet and renovating the base before relaying the same carpet, the Board is making movement towards accelerating the replacement of the entire green as we have done with green #1. The Board is now undertaking activity to allow us to get approval from members to spend the money to replace Green #2 with an approximate timeline of mid 2023. This will be very exciting and mean we will have two new greens that will roll perfectly.

The business of the club is tracking well, although still hasn't returned to the same sort of patronage as pre-covid. It appears there is a new normal and it may take a long time before the habits of people return to pre-covid times. This includes the number of visitors we get from New Zealand and down south. The good news is that things are returning towards pre-covid times and while 2022 has been a good year, we hope 2023 will be an even better year.

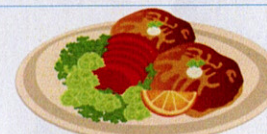

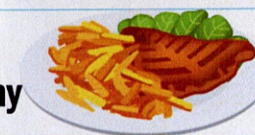

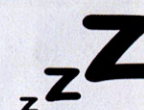

The Laws and You

"Law" Questions

- Q 1. Who is responsible to ensure that the jack is centred before the first bowl is delivered?
- Q 2. As a delivered jack is approaching the skips, the opposing skip accidentally moves it. What should happen?
- Q 3. The skip in a pennants fours game falls ill and cannot continue to play. The umpire gives permission for a substitute. Where does the substitute play?
- Q 4. A toucher rebounds from the face of the bank onto the rink of play and comes to rest 13 metres from the mat. It blocks the opposing players' line of delivery. What should happen to this toucher?
- Q 5. Before delivery, a player must be standing on the mat with all or part of at least one foot on the mat. At the moment they deliver the jack or bowl, the player must have all or part of one foot on or above the mat.

If a player does not do this, can they be penalised for foot faulting?

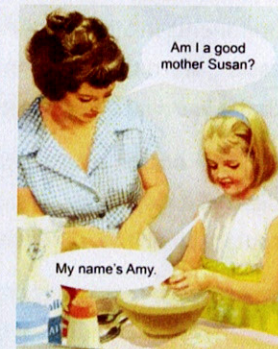

By the time you read this we should be all enjoying a game on our new green. Our Chairman Tony will be advising you of our opening of our New Green by email.

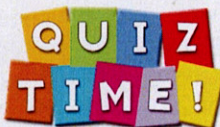

The Laws and You

"You" Answers

- A 1. The lead of the team to play first.
- A 2. The jack is re-delivered by the original player as it was displaced by the opposing skip.
- A 3. The team has to rearrange at the completion of an end as the substitute cannot play in the skip position. The new skip will be one of the other members of the fours team.
- A 4. Even though the bowls is in bounds it is less than 14 metres from the mat and therefore it is a dead bowl and must be removed from the rink.
- A 5. YES. If an umpire, either by their own observation or on appeal by one of the skips or opponents in Singles, decides that a player is foot faulting, the umpire must, on the first occasion, warn the player in the presence of the skip and advise the coach if they are present that a warning has been given.

On each occasion after this, the umpire must have the player's bowl stopped and declared dead. If it cannot be stopped and disturbs the head, the opponent must choose whether to replace the head, or leave the head as altered, or declare the end dead.
